<b>Introduction of Subject</b> Anticipatory set (Give and/or demonstrate necessary information)	Ask - what do you like to do as a family? Discuss
<b>Steps Guided Practice Verification</b> (Steps to check for student understanding)	Make sure students understand that one way to build family relations is by spending time together doing something you all enjoy.

<p><b>Activity 1</b> (Describe the independent activity to reinforce this lesson)</p>	<p>Discuss the important of doing things together as a family. Explain the benefits family time has on building relationships.</p>
<p><b>Activity 2</b> (Describe the independent activity to reinforce this lesson)</p>	<p>Have students identify games that their families enjoy Assign students to use the FCCLA planning process to plan a family game night Students will build family relationships by holding a family game night</p>
<p><b>Activity 3</b> (Describe the independent activity to reinforce this lesson)</p>	<p>Give the students 1 week to carry out their plan for a family game night</p>
<p><b>Assessment</b></p>	<p>Class discussion Game night plans</p>
<p><b>Summary/Evaluation</b> (Assign Homework, or Reflect on the Outcomes)</p>	<p>Have students reflect on the outcome of their family game night. How did it go? Anything they would do differently?</p>
