<b>Lesson Plan Goals &amp; Objectives</b> (Specify skills/information that will be learned.)	Students will identify the characteristics of a good leader. Students will identify qualities of a leader they would like to develop. Students will demonstrate leadership qualities.

<b>Introduction of Subject</b> Anticipatory set (Give and/or demonstrate necessary information)	Have students identify leaders that they admire. Discuss what they admire about them.

<p><b>Activity 1</b> (Describe the independent activity to reinforce this lesson)</p>	<p>Have students brainstorm characteristics of a leader. List on board with explanations. Discuss.</p> <p>Have students identify four characteristics that they would like to improve on in their lives.</p>
<p><b>Activity 2</b> (Describe the independent activity to reinforce this lesson)</p>	<p>Students are to use the <a href="#">FCCLA Planning Process</a> to create an action plan for developing each of the four identified leadership characteristics. Students will keep a journal to record their goals and document their progress.</p>
<p><b>Assessment</b></p>	<p>Class discussion Planning process Journals</p>
<p><b>Summary/Evaluation</b> (Assign Homework, or Reflect on the Outcomes)</p>	<p>Students will complete the follow up section of their planning process as a reflection.</p>
