

Looking back on the many IncREDible experiences I have had through FCCLA, I remember how happy it made me when I first heard about this impactful organization. Explain the importance of the integration of FCCLA into Family and Consumer Sciences education, providing examples from your own educational experiences.

When you think of Family and Consumer Sciences, you may see a sewing room with students making hats, a kitchen with cookies baking in the oven, or an aspiring teacher working on possible lesson plans. I want you to visualize an FCS classroom with an FCCLA Chapter President using the Planning Process to complete their STAR Event, a member working on their Impromptu Speaking Skill Demonstration Event, or an FCCLA advisor helping a State Officer memorize their State Leadership Conference scripts. FCCLA is integrated into FCS courses, allowing students opportunities to strengthen their personal growth and leadership in and out of the classroom.

During the 2020-2021 school year, I enrolled in an FCS class, it was virtual, but that did not stop me from finding my passion within it. Family and Consumer Sciences, along with FCCLA, cultivates the next generation of leaders by instilling real-world skills, advocacy, and service, guiding them for the rest of their lives.

During my FCS class, I learned vital standards such as personal leadership development, how to sew, and food preparation. Every year my FCS teacher Mrs. Bomar does a sewing project we like to call "The Monster Project" where kindergarten students from Primary and Elementary schools draw a picture of a monster they want to make in real life. FCS students make their monsters come to life during the sewing unit and can bring their kids the monster they made for them at the end. When I returned from being virtual for the second 9 weeks of school, I made three monsters to give to kindergarten students. It was one of the most rewarding experiences in class because my kindergarteners were so excited! They jumped up and down when I gave them their monster and original picture, along with a handwritten note about its construction.

I remember, in particular, doing a STAR Event in 2021 after learning about personal leadership in my community (AR FCS Standards). It was then that I competed in Professional Presentation on Suicide Awareness: You Matter To Me. It was my first real introduction to FCCLA. I fell in love with it right from the beginning.

In my FCS class, I assessed the benefits of active participation in FCCLA (AR FCS Standards). A vital part of active participation, to me, is leadership. I saw this standard and aspired to be in a leadership role within FCCLA. During the 2021-2022 school year, I served as the Arkansas Region II Vice President of Community Service, gaining knowledge on how to be an effective, hard-working, and diligent leader. I took the experiences and skills learned inside Mrs. Bomar's FCS classroom at Vilonia High School and used them throughout my Ultimate Leadership Experience in FCCLA as a chapter, region, and state officer to strengthen the members around me.

I firmly believe in "Taking People With You" on my journey while practicing leadership. This book has shown me that while I have been in FCCLA, I have found that everything I have done is related to my FCS course. I learned the vital standards that teach real-world skills and used my leadership to take others alongside me throughout my journey. Each skill I learned in FCS has turned into action within my life, especially during my time in FCCLA.



Franklin Delano Roosevelt once said, "We cannot always build the future for our youth, but we can build our youth for the future." FCCLA does exactly that---build our youth for the future. Since the 8th grade, I have taken advantage of every opportunity, experience, and interaction presented to me, and it has all supported my development both as an individual and as a visionary leader. I believe these integral components can directly connect and exceed the FCCLA 2022-2025 Strategic Plan.

The first part of the strategic goals is communication. Like me, the majority of teens are heavily connected to technology. FCCLA needs to take advantage of this and increase its presence to increase participation and engagement among members. We can ensure FCCLA's brand is relevant by engaging society through mass messaging texts, expanding on Pinterest, Twitter, and Youtube, and then developing an interactive FCCLA app! Then, we need to make it an initiative for members nationwide to reach out to local media to spread the mission of FCCLA! I have been showcased on my local radio and featured in newspapers numerous times!

The second part of the strategic goals is growth. Rural strategies are key to growth because of the strong rural membership in FCCLA. The "Bring a Buddy" strategy, for example, needs to be strongly implemented. It doubled my chapter, and I think it can substantially increase our membership. To add new markets and diversity to our membership, we need to reach out to students who are not native English speakers and involve students who are enrolled in charter, private, home, and virtual schools. We also have to address the many schools and states that are closing their FCS programs. We have to ensure that society sees the real-life skills instilled and the lifetong value of FCS and FCCLA. When FCS programs open up, chapters affiliate, and membership increases for both advisers and members.

The third part of the strategic goals is infrastructure. To advance our infrastructure, a few ideas come to mind from my experiences. First, we must make an effort to bring back national regional cluster meetings and Teen Times. They were fundamental to my development as a new member. In addition, a podcast educating new members and advisers would improve the process for first-year members to get involved, gain experience, and become knowledgeable. To improve the student leadership process, we must create a stronger connection and trickle down the defined leadership positions from the national to local officers through more cooperative activity and recognition throughout the year. Finally, we also need to use the expertise of A&A members and business and industry partners more effectively.

The fourth part of the strategic goals is programs. Since 1945, FCCLA has made #incREdible efforts to improve the quality of life for FCCLA members and advisers, but there is still progress to be made. To remain relevant, aligned, accessible, and consistent with all FCS teachers and students, we need to update, bring back, and add to the national programs like Leadership Service in Action; review, refine, and build partnerships like Dolly Parton's Imagination Library and Heifer International to bring awareness and support for FCCLA's mission and programs; and consider raising the national affiliation dues by \$1 to have the fiscal resources for continued expansion and development.

In brief, the 2023-2024 National Executive Council, in so many ways, will be a time of destiny for our organization, and I believe that perhaps more than at any time in our 78-year history of FCCLA, the future is in the hands of student leaders. However, this can only be accomplished if we give our best and expect the results we work for.

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Explain the importance of the integration of FCCLA into Family and Consumer Sciences education, providing examples from your own educational experiences.

Since the day I set foot into my first FCS class in junior high, I knew my life was going to change. On that day, my understanding of how fundamental and necessary the integration of FCCLA into the FCS curriculum was established, and I recognized how this integration creates a better quality of life for students, their families, careers, and communities created and cultivated.

My first day of FCSI would start with a bang, as I was introduced to FCCLA and the Planning Process. Learning how to set goals and make decisions made me realize that altough one person can make a difference, our collective successes are more #incREDible! After beign introduced to and encouraged to participate in several FCCLA national programs, I applied the lessons learned to all different aspects of my life, chapter, and community! Career Connection taught me how to put myself on the path to success. I developed real-world and leadership skills and put them to play by speaking to my local rotary club, local school board, and state legislators at Capitol Hill and during Capitol Leadership as an FCCLA officer who has served on the state, regional, and local levels. Also, I have been able to apply, get accepted, and will participate in AR Boy's State and AR Governor's School!

The next national program I was introduced to was Community Service! Through Community Service, my chapter, my family, and I have donated, volunteered, and participated in many non-profit organizations, all with the purpose of helping address social issues. Many donated items and time would go to Operation Christmas Child, an international non-profit that provides school supplies, hygiene products, and toys to underprivileged children globally; the battered women's shelter, which provides products for domestic abuse victims; the AR Children's Hospital Festival of Stars toy drive; and the local nursing home, which we visited as a chapter. We also helped address hunger issues by holding a canned food drive, serving meals at a local pantry called the Bread of Life, volunteering at the Arkansas Food Bank, working in the Scrapper Pantry, which is an in-school backpack program that provides food for K-12 students, and raising money to benefit Helfer International, a charity that helps impoverished families become self-sufficient through the gift of livestock. Through these events, we created friendships and became stronger members of society!

In addition to personal and community improvement, my chapter and I also worked to address students and how they can improve their quality of life! We incorporated Student Body by encouraging stduents to use FCCLA@theTable, teaching simple, healthy recipes from Share Our Strength's Cooking Matters, and using the free ebook A-Z Fun book of Fruits and Veggies from the American Obesity Foundation to encourage students to try new fruits and vegetables. These experiences would lead me to not only study and pass my Arkansas ServSafe Food Handler's certification but to continue to take advantage of the opportunities presented by FCCLA's integration into the FCS coursework by taking Exploring Personal Finance and Financial Literacy classes. I participated in the Real Deal, budgeting, and making wise financial choices like opening my first bank account and completing my MoneySKILL's certification. Accordingly, I will be applying these lessons for the Financial Fitness award.

As I reflect on the successful, positive changes that resulted from taking my first FCS class, I can't overlook the #incREDible role FCCLA has played in my FCS education. From gaining leadership and life skills to building lifelong friendships, some of the most invaluable components of my FCS journey were built by experiences I had through FCCLA. The integration of FCCLA into the FCS curriculum plays an evidently vital role in raising the quality of life for students, their families, careers, and communities.

Due to judges for STAR events being volunteers it is hard to know if everyone will be judged fairly. A solution I propose to try and solve this problem is a Zoom call before Nationals. Ask the volunteers to get on a Zoom call before Nationals if possible and breakdown how to fairly judge the STAR event participants. Break it into breakout rooms if possible and go over their assigned event that they will be judging. This ensures fair judging across the board. This will help your programs to prosper and help strengthen the infrastructure.

The FCCLA strategic plan will help the orginization to prosper. As a possible future member of the National Executive Council that is what we strive towards. FCCLA is an incREDible organization that with the above suggestions can just get stronger.

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Explain the importance of the integration of FCCLA into Family and Consumer Sciences education, providing examples from your own educational experiences.

Integrating FCCLA into Family and Consumer Sciences education (FCS) is very important for both programs. Family and Consumer Sciences education teaches students many important life skills for their future. Some of these skills include: how to cook, sew, care for young children, knife skills, kitchen safety, how to communicate and provide care to others, and so much more. FCCLA allows students to put these learned skills into action and prepare students for their future. Students put these skills into action through competitive events at all levels; District/ Regional, State, and even National. This allows students to be introduced to new ideas utilizing these skills.

Personally, I have taken full advantage of the FCS courses taught within my school district. Some of the courses I have taken are Child Development, Fashion, and Human Services. All of these courses allow me to learn new skills and apply them with FCCLA. Child Development taught me how to properly care for a child and keep them engaged and excited while FCCLA allows my chapter and I to hold various events that keep the younger participants engaged throughout the night. Fashion taught me how to enhance my sewing skills and FCCLA gives others and I numerous opportunities to use these skills. From completing STAR events in the fashion category to making many different things to sell in order to raise money for the chapter and trips. In my chapter we have made blankets to donate to animal shelters and to the homeless. In the Human Services course it has given me the ability to work and communicate with others at a better level than before. I use these skills within FCCLA almost everyday. Reaching out to partner with local businesses, bringing in guest speakers to talk at both the chapter and state level, and leading sessions to both large and small groups. Without these FCS courses and FCCLA a lot of these experiences would have never happened.

In Fashion Ugly Quilts were made to donate to the elderly. Headbands and pillow cases were also made to sell at the FCCLA craft show. In Human Services we plan and prepare for our upcoming events held within FCCLA. We have written letters to veterans, teachers, and the elderly in all the courses. Time is also set aside to work on FCCLA STAR events each year.

Due to FCCLA being integrated into Family and Consumer Sciences education is how FCCLA continues to grow as an organization. I personally joined FCCLA in the sixth grade due to taking Family and Consumer Sciences. When I first walked into the room there was information about FCCLA. This sparked my interest along with many others. The teacher would talk about FCCLA and convince me to join. Integrating FCCLA into FCS allows both programs to thrive. 

When reading this prompt, one of my favorite quotes by Helen Keller immediately came to mind. It reads, "Life is a succession of lessons which must be lived to be understood". I believe this quote (while applicable to all facets of life), is especially true when it comes to being a National Officer. In order to serve as a leader, it is critical to use the knowledge gained from the past to cultivate a better future. If elected to the National Executive Council, I will utilize my incREDible FCCLA experiences to provide support to newcomers, increase communication amongst members, and effectively improve the infrastructure of our organization.

One of my most formative experiences within FCCLA was becoming a member during the Covid-19 pandemic. As we are all acutely aware, the pandemic forced FCCLA to adapt in unforeseen ways, and my chapter was no different. Because of the amount of problems being tackled on a daily basis, matters like introducing new members were not thoroughly addressed. While I completely understood the situation, I can still vividly recall feeling overwhelmed or intimidated, and wishing for more resources aimed at new members. When I became a state officer, we were exiting the Covid-19 era. and things were finally beginning to return to normal. For Growth, making information/assistance accessible for newcomers aids in member retention and increased member activity. In simpler terms, students who feel supported are more likely to take an active approach to FCCLA.

Another experience that has drastically impacted me within FCCLA occurred at this year's State Leadership Conference; while participating in the Round Robin (as part of re-running for State Office), I had the chance to speak directly with members from across the state. One idea I brought up was met with unanimously enthusiastic support, increasing member representation. Having participated in FCCLA as both a member and a State Officer, I firmly believe that increasing member input is imperative to the success of our organization - after all, how can we improve things for our members if we don't KNOW what needs to be improved? As officers, it is our duty to act as representatives of the broader whole - to do this, i'd strive to promote interactive social media initiatives, increase voting opportunities for members, and conduct polling to better understand what needs to be improved. These ideas support the Strategic Plan's Communication, Growth, and Infrastructure areas; For Communication, there is increased transfer of information between members and National Officers. For Growth, increased social media initiatives draws in new members and helps increase National Officer visibility. For Infrastructure, polls/voting help us effectively improve processes/systems, and can possibly even pertain to Programs (if members feel they need altered).

Whenever I am approached by a teacher interested in starting an FCCLA chapter, one of the first things I highlight is how beautifully FCCLA can be integrated into a classroom setting. It is underliably true that Family and Consumer Sciences is an underrepresented field, and that FCS educators often lack the resources and support necessary to make a meaningful impact in the lives of their students. FCCLA does an incredible job of addressing the issue by providing resources, experiences, and opportunities that reinforce FCS in a more tangible way. The integration of FCCLA into Family and Consumer Sciences is imperative to helping educators take their lessons from classroom concepts to real-world skills.

While attending the Indiana Family and Consumer Sciences Conference just a week ago, I had the pleasure of speaking with a myriad of FCS educators from across the state of Indiana. While conversing with these amazing individuals, many had questions regarding FCCLA. They inquired, What are the benefits of having a chapter?", "How can it help our kids grow as FCS students?", and "How would FCCLA work to support us as teachers?" I was delighted to receive their questions, and even more delighted to explain just how significant of a difference FCCLA can make for students when integrated into FCS education.

I began by explaining FCCLA's role as a co-curricular (rather than an extra-curricular) organization, and our unique position in supporting both students and teachers in FCS. FCCLA provides educational resources; a network of teachers and students who work to guide and encourage one another; and countless opportunities for students to implement FCS skills and knowledge through community service projects, competitive events, running for an elected position, and attending conferences. I additionally emphasized the FCCLA Career Pathways, and how essential they are to helping students find careers in FCS that support their passions.

To further enforce the importance of integrating FCCLA into FCS, I shared just how transformative an experience FCCLA has been for me and countless others as FCS students. As a new student my freshman year, I felt a severe lack of direction; I did not know what classes to take, what career to pursue, or who I really wanted to be. It wasn't until being introduced to Family and Consumer Sciences and becoming a member of FCCLA that I at last found the sense of purpose I had been searching for. It was through participating in my STAR event (advocating and educating on the child abuse crisis), being exposed to career speakers and sessions at State and National Conferences, and learning more about the multitudinous opportunities within FCS that I realized I wanted a career in human services. Because of FCCLA, I knew that I was called to advocate for others, and have since been interested in pursuing psychology after graduation.

The best part is, my story is by no means unique. As a chapter and state officer, I have had the privilege of witnessing countless other students transform from timid, lost individuals to confident, purposeful members of an organization dedicated to supporting them in their pursuit of a career within FCS. In conclusion, FCCLA is an invaluable tool for educators to take the lessons being taught in the Family and Consumer Sciences classroom and apply them to real-world opportunities.

As my soon-advisor began to explain the procedures of how our meetings' would work, she began to explain how the culinary meetings are an extension of FCCLA. At this point I hadn't taken an FCCLA course yet, however, it excited me to be able to participate in a course that would teach me skills for life. Once I began to take a Family and Consumer Sciences course, it was clear to see the overlap between a Family and Consumer Sciences course and FCCLA.

As a member, we would participate in activities such as making dog pillows for Hudson Valley Animal Rescue Shelter (HVARS). My middle school chapter was prepared to do this service project by taking a family and consumer science course. In our course, we spent a unit learning about different sewing techniques that could be used when working on a project. In class, we were tasked with making a little monster adorned with buttons, with different types of stitches, and filled with stuffing. Through this project, we were able to learn and prepare ourselves with the skills that could help us do a good deed for our community. Following the unit, during our next FCCLA meeting, we were able to make dog toys for HVARS. As we made the dog pillows, we used the skills from our family and consumer sciences course to leave a legacy in our community.







This quote truly applies to my experiences in FCCLA. Since I have strengthened my leadership skills, I understand the importance of watching other leaders develop and follow their dreams. For most members, FCCLA would not be a part of their lives without the integration into Family and Consumer Sciences. 



For the strategic goals in the areas of communications and growth, I believe the organization needs to fully embrace technology. By embracing technology and multiple social media platforms, we can better reach FCCLA members and produce more engagement. This is a tool that is constantly growing. Most youth today have social media accounts that they check often and the best way to reach them is through their peers. My next idea is to create a challenge to all Chapter Presidents to make at least one post a week showing the activities and involvement of their chapter in the community. The local advisers would be tasked with overseeing these posts. We could turn this into a contest with winners in every state. It could be called the "Promote Positive FCCLA Experiences Campaign" to raise awareness of all the many fun and educational opportunities FCCLA has available. I also believe that we must continue to foster partnerships with industries, organizations, and legislators. Ensuring that these partners receive consistent communication from the organization will be vital in maintaining and developing new partnerships.

I have two potential ideas geared toward the programs strategic goal. The first is to develop a new national program that centers around mental health. Although there is a unit on mental health in our current Student Body program, I believe that this is the number one issue facing students today, and we need a stand alone program dedicated to this area. We must continue to develop initiatives that meet the changing needs of our members. Family and Consumer Sciences education provides students with a foundation and valuable information in many different areas they can use throughout their lives. Integrating FCCLA into the FCS classroom gives students the opportunity to implement and develop skills and knowledge in areas that are essential for their personal and professional lives.

Family and Consumer Sciences education is a large field that covers various areas such as nutrition, parenting, textiles, interior design, and personal finance. By integrating FCCLA into this curriculum, students can gain practical experience in these areas, which can help them make informed decisions in their personal lives. For instance, when students learn about nutrition and food service, they can apply this knowledge to make healthier food choices for themselves and their families. In my FCS program, FCCLA members gain valuable industry experience by providing catering services for many different school and community functions. This is integrated into the classroom curriculum and into the regular classroom schedule. Non-FCCLA members also gain this professional knowledge. In my chapter, we have seen an increase in membership resulting from integrating FCCLA projects and programs into regular coursework.

Similarly, when students in our program learn about personal finance, they develop financial management skills that will enable them to make sound financial decisions in the future. This can include using skills in research, planning, organizing, public speaking, community service and teamwork to name a few. FCCLA also allows members to network and meet members from all over the state and nation. They make many new memories and friendships that can last a lifetime. All of these experiences help students to be prepared for their future careers and life. 





As we support the communication goal, it will be essential to create a conversation guide or a flow chart for FCCLA members to fully explain FCS and FCCLA. Throughout my experience advocating for FCS, members would know adequate information about FCS/FCCLA, but they did not know how to present it. Depending on the individual, you may have to ensure key points are discussed, so they better understand. There is a difference between explaining FCS to different types of people, such as community leaders, business owners, parents, students, and even government officials. 





"Look, if you had one shot, or one opportunity to seize everything you ever wanted, one moment, would you capture it or just let it slip? Picture it; my palms are sweaty, knees weak, arms are heavy." Well, not actually... those are the opening lyrics to the song "Lose Yourself" by Eminem. During the 2022-2023 school year, I had the incredible opportunity to help assist with a Nutrition and Wellness FCS class lesson. The class was made up of about ten students, many had never made more than microwave macaroni and cheese. They were tasked with making thirty dozen cookies. I came in and helped with the mixing process. At first, I was like the Eminem song "Lose Yourself"; I was nervous to try and oversee ten high school boys who had never made cookies before. However, my experiences in FCCLA helped keep me calm, cool, and collected. I realized FCCLA had taught me to overcome more challenging tasks than baking cookies.







Family, Career and Community Leaders of America is a national influential, dynamic career and technical student organization promoting personal growth through Family and Consumer Sciences. The 2022-2025 Strategic Plan supports a common goal of FCS educators preparing students for their future career endeavors. This goal can be achieved by introducing new, modern programs. Communication between youth and adults is one of the many assets acquired through FCCLA. As future leaders, students will use this skill in day-to-day life. One of the main ways to reach youth is through social media and being active on various platforms. Throughout my term, I have learned ways to advocate for FCCLA to expand partnerships, even at our chapter level. 
