Real ID Reminder

As you prepare to attend our National Conference, ensure your identification meets new federal travel standards. Starting May 7, 2025, a Real ID will be required for all individuals aged 18 and older to board domestic flights and access federal buildings. Children under 18 are not required to have a Real ID for air travel, as they can fly with an accompanying adult with the necessary identification. However, if you're 18 or older, you will need a Real ID, a valid passport, or another TSA-approved form of documentation. A star in the top-right corner identifies a Real ID and meets federal security standards.

Ride Share Services

Once you arrive at the airport, you must arrange ground transportation to the hotel. The airport is approximately 13 miles from the various hotels. Plan ahead by reviewing the options below for transportation between the airport and the hotel.

Public Transportation

Orlando is a highly accessible city with a variety of convenient transportation options to help you navigate your visit with ease. Whether you're exploring the city's top attractions, dining destinations, or conference venues, you'll find reliable and affordable ways to get around. Two popular options include the **I-Ride Trolley**, which provides a fun and budget-friendly way to travel along International Drive, and the **LYNX Bus System**, offering an extensive network of routes connecting key areas throughout Orlando.

I-RIDE Trolley

The I-RIDE Trolley is exclusive, convenient, and affordable transportation to hundreds of exciting Orlando destinations within the International Drive Area. It operates daily between 8:00 AM and 10:30 PM. The I-RIDE Trolley transportation service consists of 17 climate-controlled replica trolleys. Each trolley seats 41 riders, has 54 total capacities, includes two wheelchair positions, and has an ADA-specified hydraulic lift system; weight limitations apply.

Passes are not sold on Trolleys. They can be purchased at over 100 locations within the International Drive Resort Area and from the I-Ride sales office. Unlimited hop-on/hop-off passes can be purchased online here.

The Red Line route services the north and southbound International Drive and runs approximately every 20 minutes. The Green Line route travels along Universal Boulevard and then shadows the Red Line route on South International Drive. Green Line trolleys run approximately every 60 minutes. - Child fare \$1.00 per ride (ages 3 to 9 with paying adult)
- Children under 3 ride FREE
- Senior citizen (65 and over) fare is \$0.25 per ride

Three-Day Pass: \$8.00 per person
Five Day Pass: \$10.00 per person
Seven Day Pass: \$16.00 per person

LYNX bus

The area's public bus system, LYNX, has routes servicing the Orange County Convention Center and connecting to the Orlando International Airport and Downtown Orlando.

- Fixed Route 7-Day Youth Pass-\$8.00
- Fixed Route All-Day Pass-\$4.50
- Fixed Route 7-Day Standard Pass-\$16.00


PARKING OPTIONS

Hotel Parking

Most hotels provide self-parking and/or valet parking on their premises. Click <u>here</u> to view specific negotiated parking rates at each hotel on the Hotels-at-a-Glance spreadsheet under Resources.

Orange County Convention Center Parking

The Convention Center offers multiple parking options. For more information, click here. The center is cashless and has four lots near the West Concourse. Parking spaces are available on a first-come, first-served basis, and rates vary depending on vehicle size and entry time. Current parking rates are \$20.00 per vehicle but are subject to change. Overnight parking is not allowed at the OCCC.



Walt Disney World Theme Park Parking

Guests pay one fee for a parking pass that is good all day at all 4 theme parks—<u>Magic Kingdom park</u>, <u>EPCOT</u>, <u>Disney's Hollywood Studios</u> and <u>Disney's Animal Kingdom theme park</u>. The special preferred parking lots are located conveniently close to the theme park entrances. All parking fees include applicable sales tax.

- Standard parking: car or motorcycle \$30 per day
- Preferred parking: car or motorcycle \$45, \$50 or \$55 per day*
- Oversized Vehicle Parking: Shuttle, Limo, Camper Trailer, RV, Bus or Tractor Trailer \$35 per day



Parking fees are nonrefundable, including preferred parking fees. Parking is limited and subject to availability. Paying a parking fee does not guarantee parking availability if a guest leaves and returns to the same theme park later in the day or if a guest visits a different theme park.

*Pricing is seasonal and will vary based on date of visit.

Courtesy trams have returned to all 4 theme parks. This convenient mode of transportation takes guests from the theme park's parking lot to its Main Entrance (or to the Ticket and Transportation Center when visiting Magic Kingdom Park) and back.

Disney Springs Parking

Standard self-parking is complimentary at the Disney Springs area.

Parking is available in surface parking lots and in 3 parking garages with direct access to Disney Springs. When planning your visit to and from Disney Springs, please allow at least 60 minutes of travel time for arrival to your destination. Follow directional signage to available parking, which may be located just a short walk away from Disney Springs.

Universal Orlando Resort Theme Parks and Universal City Walk Parking

There is one parking area for all of the Universal Orlando Resort theme parks and Universal City Walk. Use this address for the parking garage area:

The enclosed parking garage features moving sidewalks, escalators, elevators, and on-site wheelchair rental. Vehicles can leave the garage and return the same day by stopping at the toll plaza upon re-entry and presenting their parking ticket.

Daily Parking Fees Per Vehicle

-Prime Parking: \$50-\$60 -Prime Upgrade: \$18-\$28 -RV/Bus Parking: \$42 -Regular Parking: \$32

Parking is seasonal and may vary by day

Orlando Health Virtual Care Center - In Central Lobby (Hall WC)

In partnership with Visit Orlando and Orlando Health, a new virtual care center inside the Orange County Convention Center is now open and located in the West Building near the Central Lobby. Medical providers will be available virtually to evaluate the medical conditions of attendees during large conventions. The Virtual Care Center will be staffed by an Orlando Health team member who can assist in setting up the virtual sessions for those visiting the Center. If minor care is needed, the Orlando Health team member can help connect visitors to a medical provider via a virtual visit in the Center's private room. A valid health insurance card is needed to take advantage of this service.

SAFETY TIPS

As the No. 1 travel destination in the U.S., Orlando takes safety extremely seriously. Visitors are advised to observe basic safety procedures, adhere to local laws, and report crime to appropriate officials.

- Remove your conference badge when leaving the conference venues; don't draw attention to yourself and the fact that you're a tourist.
- Walk in well-lit areas; Use designated walkways and crosswalks.
- Safety in numbers: Stay in groups when exploring the city.
- Be aware of your surroundings. Keep your eyes up and not on your phone.
- Keep the address and phone number of where you're staying in your phone in case you find yourself turned around.
- Do not carry large amounts of cash. Use debit/credit cards.
- Pay attention to your instincts; if something doesn't feel right, you can always ask for help at a business or hotel.
- Keep hotel room numbers private. Keep track of room keys. If a key is lost, ask for a different room, or ask for the locks to be changed.
- Use all locks on the hotel door, particularly the double lock. Always lock the door when leaving.
- When returning to your room, ensure you have your room key out and ready.
- Never automatically open your door when a knock is heard. Know your visitor's identity prior to admittance. Use your peephole, if available, or talk through the locked door. If someone claims they are from maintenance, security, or a hotel employee, phone the front desk to make sure the visitor is legitimate

Orlando Police Department Precincts

Orlando's most popular tourism corridor—a 78-square-mile area encompassing the International Drive and Lake Buena Vista areas—is home to a well-established, dedicated law enforcement unit focused specifically on safety known as



TOPS (Tourist Oriented Policing Squad). The TOPS Public Safety Program allows for enhanced coverage along International Drive including the Orange County Convention Center (OCCC), hotels, dining, and shopping areas. This group:

- Increased presence of bike patrols, marked cars and officers on foot throughout the area
- Addressed the needs of meeting attendees, tourists, and area employees

This unit provides a proactive, visible law enforcement presence through a force of 150 deputies and officers from the Orange County Sheriff's Office (OCSO) and the Orlando Police Department. Member officers provide high visibility to deter crime, conduct routine security checks, patrol the area, and offer friendly assistance to Orlando visitors. The program has been in place for decades and has been replicated in other communities.
