Activity Day 2: FCCLA Day of Service

Activity 1 Materials Needed: Construction Paper (Red and White encouraged), Scissors, Glue or Tape Directions:

Mini Lesson: Take advantage of FCCLA Week by hosting a Funds2Orgs Shoe Drive, mark Tuesday as the collection day within your school, and even extend it to your community. - Support job creation in the United States through our shoe-drive fundraising company.

Make it a Challenge:

Here is some fun way to make the shoe drive a challenge and increase participation:

- Make it a school-wide challenge! Pit the Freshman against the Sophomores, create rivalries between homerooms, or challenge different departments. The goal? Collect the most shoes for a great cause! The winner gets creative prizes like pizza, donuts, or early release—work with school administrators for fun, creative prizes for a good cause.
- Engage your community in the shoe drive! Reach out to the fire department and police department and propose a friendly competition between them. The winner earns the esteemed "bragging rights" title.
- Establish multiple drop-off locations throughout town, including the newspaper, radio station, community center, and more. Spread the word about the shoe drive and promote the impactful initiatives of FCCLA.

Additional Ideas:

- Host a service fundraiser using the national fundraising partner, WeHelpTwo, asking everyone who buys a pair of socks to wear them on Friday of FCCLA Week.
- Use the FCCLA Planning Process to plan a Community Service project. After your students implement their plan, submit information for National Recognition as a National Program Award through the Program Awards tab in the FCCLA Portal.
- Ask your students what community service means to them. Community service can be big or small; for FCCLA week, challenge your students to develop as many easy and quick service project ideas as they can think of.
 Instruct them to write each idea down on a <u>paper airplane</u>. Tape all the ideas around your room or even the school!
