Launch FCCLA week by showcasing your chapter members and what FCCLA means to you!

Grade Level: Any

Learning Objectives:

Students will learn about FCCLA:

Family, Career and Community Leaders of America (FCCLA) is a national Career and Technical Student Organization (CTSO) for young men and women in Family and Consumer Sciences (FCS) education in public and private schools through grade 12. FCCLA offers intra-curricular resources and opportunities for students to pursue careers that support families. Since 1945, FCCLA members have been making a difference in their families, careers, and communities by addressing important personal, work, and societal issues through Family and Consumer Sciences education. Be sure to share all FCCLA week activities using the hashtag #FCCLAweek.

Activity Day 1: FCCLA Member Monday

Activity Ideas:

- Member Appreciation Wall: Create a "Member Appreciation Wall" in a prominent location within your school. Write your members' names on the <u>FCCLA Red Blazer cutout</u>, or even cut out pictures and glue them on the blazers! Beneath their blazers, encourage members to reflect on the impact FCCLA has had on their lives. Have them share where FCCLA has led them and how their FCCLA journey will contribute to their future careers.
- Kick-off FCCLA week by having students complete the <u>My Membership Journey worksheet</u>. Provide opportunities for students to share their answers. Provide an FCCLA Red Blazer cutout to take a picture and share on social media using the #FCCLAweek hashtag.
- Have students use the information they learned during the *My Membership Journey* worksheet to create a 30-second PSA to highlight why being a member of FCCLA is an incredible experience.
- Handout the FCCLA Creed Speaking & Interpretation guidelines found on the FCCLA Portal > Resources > Competitive Events > Skill Demonstration Event Guidelines. Challenge them to memorize the FCCLA Creed by Friday! Offer prizes to those who are able to memorize it (extra credit, candy, etc.).
- Instruct students to complete the Step 1 WebQuest (answers are in the portal)
- Host a chapter breakfast before school to kick off the week for members, and consider inviting teachers to show your appreciation for their support of your chapter.
- Encourage members to share videos on social media about their membership journey or how being a member of FCCLA has impacted them. Then tag National FCCLA and use the #FCCLAweek hashtag.
- Invite a former FCCLA member or someone who has benefited from FCCLA to share their experiences and success stories with your students. This is a great opportunity to connect how the skills they learned in FCCLA helped them in their career.
- As a warm-up activity or a reward for students completing their assignment, have them play the FCCLA Jenga, Spoons and Mania located in the FCCLA Portal > Resources > Lesson Plans.
