- Helped FCCLA reach its goals

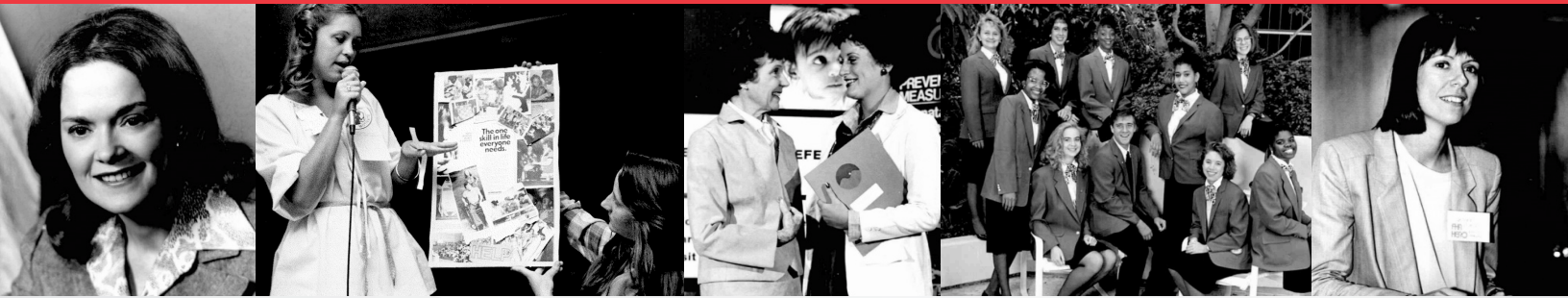
