PERSONAL FINANCE: PRESENTED BY EVERFI

An individual STAR Event that challenges students to apply Family and Consumer Sciences and financial literacy knowledge from EVERFI to real-life financial scenarios. Participants will set SMART financial goals, create budgets, track spending, and adjust plans based on their experiences and insights gained from EVERFI's financial education digital lessons. This competition promotes financial well-being and empowers students to make informed financial decisions.

ELIGIBILITY & GENERAL INFORMATION

- 1. Review "Eligibility and General Rules for All Levels of Competition" on page 8 prior to event planning and preparation.
- 2. Participants are encouraged to bring fully charged devices, such as laptops, tablets etc., to use for audiovisual *electronic portfolio* presentation at competition.
- 3. Chapters with multiple entries in this event must submit different projects for each entry. All projects must be developed and completed during a one-year span beginning July 1 and ending June 30 of the school year before the National Leadership Conference (NLC) and must be the work of the participant(s) only.
- 4. Online Orientation National Leadership Conference (NLC) participants are required to view the online orientation video and submit the STAR Events Online Orientation Form by the deadline to receive their one (1) point on the Personal Finance STAR Events Point Summary Form. The video and form will be on the FCCLA Student Portal and can be found under Surveys/Applications. The video and form cannot be completed through the FCCLA Adviser Portal. Only one form per entry/participant is required. Contact your State Adviser for orientation procedures for competitions held prior to the National Leadership Conference (NLC).
- 5. **STAR Events Schedule Confirmation** Chapter Advisers are required to confirm National Leadership Conference competitors' STAR Events Schedule in the FCCLA Portal by the date outlined on the FCCLA Website (Competitive Events Dates & Deadlines) for competitors to receive their one (1) point on the Points Summary Form. This must be completed in the FCCLA Adviser Portal by visiting the Meetings & Events tab, selecting the National Leadership Conference, and choosing "Confirm STAR Competition."
